FACILITIES, OUTDOOR.

The current facility perimeter fence enclosing the wild/exotic hoof stock is only five feet in height. Outdoor facilities for these regulated animals must be enclosed by a fence that is of sufficient height to keep unauthorized animals and persons out and function as a secondary containment system for the animals in the facility. Perimeter fences less than six feet high must be approved in writing by the Administrator.

The perimeter fence should be adjusted to meet the six foot height requirement or the facility may apply for a variance authorizing deviation from this requirement.

(a) Each dealer or exhibitor shall have an attending veterinarian who shall provide adequate veterinary care to its animals in compliance with this section.

(1) Each dealer and exhibitor shall employ an attending veterinarian under formal arrangements. In the case of a part-time attending veterinarian or consultant arrangements, the formal arrangements shall include a written program of veterinary care and regularly scheduled visits to the premises of the dealer or exhibitor.

Facilities which do not have a full-time attending veterinarian must have a written Program of Veterinary Care (PVC). This Program must consist of a properly completed APHIS Form 7002 or an equivalent format providing all of the information required by the APHIS form. The attending veterinarian must visit the facility on a regular basis, i.e., often enough to provide adequate oversight of the facility's care and use of animals but no less than annually. Records of visits by the attending veterinarian must be kept to include dates of the visits and comments or recommendations of the attending veterinarian or other veterinarians. The PVC must be reviewed and updated whenever necessary (e.g., as a new species of animal or a new attending veterinarian is obtained, or the preventive medical program changes). It must be initialed and dated by both the attending veterinarian and the facility representative whenever it is changed or reviewed without change. The preventive medical program described in the PVC is expected to be in accordance with common good veterinary practices (e.g., appropriate vaccinations, diagnostic testing). It should include zoonotic disease prevention measures and, if necessary, special dietary prescriptions.

Management needs to develop and maintain a program of veterinary care which includes all animals on premise.

Indoor housing facilities must be sufficiently ventilated at all times when nonhuman primates are present to provide for their health and well-being and to minimize odors, drafts, ammonia levels, and moisture condensation. Ventilation must be provided by windows, doors, vents, fans, or air conditioning. Auxiliary ventilation, such as fans, blowers, or air conditioning, must be provided when the ambient temperature is 85 [deg]F (29.5 [deg]C)

or higher. The relative humidity maintained must be at a level that ensures the health and well-being of the animals housed, as directed by the attending veterinarian, in accordance with generally accepted professional and husbandry practices.

Management was informed that the ventilation (fans) that are being used for some of the primates were inadequate due to the temperature in Texas during the hot summer months. A better ventilation system is needed for the indoor housing facilities of the non-human primates.

(c) Housekeeping for premises. Premises where housing facilities are located, including buildings and surrounding grounds, must be kept clean and in good repair.

The door to the commissory is rustic and corroded and needs to be replaced. The door jams of the utility room and commissory are damaged and needs to be replaced.

(d) Pest control. An effective program for control of insects, external parasites affecting nonhuman primates, and birds and mammals that are pests, must be established and maintained so as to promote the health and well-being of the animals and reduce contamination by pests in animal areas.

It was noted that the commissory and the primary enclosure housing two lemurs contained rodent feces on the floor. This noncompliant item was pointed out management for correction. Management was informed that an effective program for control of mammals (rodents) that are pests must be established and maintained so as to promote the health and well-being of the animals and reduce contamination by pests in animal areas.

(2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries, and the availability of emergency, weekend, and holiday care.

Nine vials of expired tetanus antitoxin injections, one 1000 ml 5% Dextrose Solution and a bottle of acepromazine were noted in the pharmaceutical section of the food processing room. The expired drugs and dextrose solutions were pointed out to management and it was explained that the use of expired medical materials such as drugs, fluids, or sutures on regulated animals is not considered to be acceptable veterinary practice and does not constitute adequate veterinary care as required by the regulations promulgated under the Animal Welfare Act. All expired medical materials found in a licensed or registered facility are to be brought to the attention of the responsible official. The facility must either dispose of all such materials or segregate them in an appropriately labeled, physically separate location from non-expired medical materials. The Animal & Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) has no jurisdiction over facilities using expired medical materials for non-regulated animals or non-regulated activities.

The expired medical materials were labeled expired and physically separated from the non-expired medical materials immediately.

Wood perches in several primate primary enclosures contained damaged wood. Three primary enclosures contained wooden floors with flaking paint and one outside rotten wood perch for the two gibbons needed to be repaired, replaced and must be constructed in a manner and made of materials that allow them to be readily cleaned and sanitized. These non-compliant items were pointed out and explained to management.

Rust in several non-contact areas that affects the integrity of the structural strength of the enclosures will need to be repaired or replaced was discussed in the exit briefing. Five (1ml) vials and one 100ml (partial used for treatment) antibiotics were noted in the pharmaceutical section of the food processing room. The expired drugs were pointed out to management and it was explained that the use of expired medical materials such as drugs, fluids, or suture materials on regulated animals is not considered to be acceptable veterinary practice and does not constitute adequate veterinary care as required by the regulations promulgated under the Animal Welfare Act. All expired medical materials found in a licensed or registered facility are to be brought to the attention of the responsible official. The facility must either dispose of all such materials or segregate them in an appropriately labeled, physically separate location from non-expired medical materials. The Animal & Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) has no jurisdiction over facilities using expired medical materials for non-regulated animals or non-regulated activities. This is a repeated citation which was cited in the last routine inspection conducted on May 10, 2011.

Floors may be made of dirt, absorbent bedding, sand, gravel, grass, or other similar material that can be readily cleaned, or can be removed or replaced whenever cleaning does not eliminate odors, diseases, pests, insects, or vermin. Any surfaces that come in contact with nonhuman primates must: (ii) Be free of jagged edges or sharp points that might injure the animals.
